About our community survey

At the end of 2021, guided by the Church of Scotland, our church distributed questionnaires to as many people as possible within our communities and congregation. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete one.

The purpose of the questionnaires was to better understand the feelings of the parish about our community and the parish church allowing us to think about how we as a church

can work to have a more proactive involvement within the local community. The seven questions asked were provided by the Church of Scotland.

- What would you say is the most exciting thing that has happened in our community / church in the last five years?
- Looking ahead five years, what would you most like to happen here? (church / community)
- 3. What are the most pressing needs of our community?
- 4. Besides buildings and money, what resources would the communities need to make these happen?
- 5. What do you see the church doing in our community?
- 6. What would you like to see the church doing more of in the community?
- 7. Would you say that the church building is easily accessible to all?

We were very happy to get a 30% response rate to the questionnaire distribution. The summary of the responses is too large to put in this small newsletter but can be accessed from the link on the home page of the Arrochar Parish Church website at

was important also to share the
results of the questionnaire

As a church we will be using the results to plan ways to increase our visibility, relevance and usefulness to the community. This newsletter is one way that we hope to increase communication of the church within the community.

Arrochar Parish Church Going Forward

Currently Arrochar Parish
Church does not have a
minister, following the retiral of
Rev Louis Bezuidenhout.
Unfortunately, this is not a
unique situation for the Church
of Scotland and at present there
are approximately 400 churches
without ministers.

Despite having no minister, we are still open for worship and our services are held at 10am every Sunday led by different worship leaders each week. We are always keen to welcome visitors to our services.

There had been some discussion about the possibility of Arrochar Parish Church uniting with the Lochside Parishes (Roseneath, Kilcreggan & Garelochhead) to share the ministers. However, at last year's General Assembly (the key decision forum for the Church of Scotland) a report was presented highlighting the limited number of ministers available and that there was no

imminent likelihood of improvement. Following this report all possible changes to Parishes & their ministers were put on hold and each region was charged with producing a new plan by the end of 2022 this has to take account of the reduction in ministerial numbers. Our region is looking to produce a draft plan by September.

We therefore await the new plan and, in the meantime, give thanks for the support and assistance we receive from our band of Worship Leaders who lead us each Sunday.

The church is open to visitors every Wednesday 1pm – 2.30pm
