


Arrochar Parish Newsletter Winter 2023

The Future of our Parish

We are making progress with the joining together of Arrochar, Luss and Rhu & Shandon parishes into one united parish. The next stages in this process will see Rev lan Millar, who lives in Succoth, allocated to us which will allow him to conduct our Sunday services 2 weeks out of 3, with the other week being covered by a visiting preacher as presently happens. This is a great step forward giving us a basis of stability and a regular face most weeks.

The other progress we have been making is to formalise the linkage between the three congregations, as a first step towards a complete union. Arrochar is currently linked with Luss whilst Rhu & Shandon have recently severed their linkage with Helensburgh. The plan is to create a new linkage of Arrochar, Luss and Rhu & Shandon which has to be agreed by all three congregations, the target date for this is the end of February 2024. We are also continuing to meet together as we plan the steps towards a full union of the three parishes into one parish, retaining all three churches for Sunday worship. At that point we will be able to look to call a permanent minister for our new Three Lochs Parish.

Loch Lomond Tragedy - August 1828 - Part 2

In the last newsletter we told the story of the disaster at Tarbet in 1828 when ten people drowned.

Three of the dead had local connections and efforts have been made to find out more about them.

Statutory registration of births, marriages and deaths was not introduced, in Scotland, until 1855. Churches kept records of marriages and births/baptisms but only rarely deaths or burials. Another complication is that Parish Records were not always reliable or complete.

Headstones can fill in some of the gaps, but unfortunately Andrew MacFarlane's headstone is very badly weathered and can provide little further information apart from his age at death -35 years.



At this point things become tricky. There are records of two babies named Andrew MacFarlane born in 1793; one in Luss and the other in Drymen.

Records also show two Andrew MacFarlanes married in Arrochar at about the right time.

One had three sons and two daughters, but significantly two of them were born too late to be children of 'our' Andrew MacFarlane. The other had three daughters all born before the date of the tragedy.

Andrew MacFarlane married Isabel or Isabella McMurrich in 1823. The record of their marriage gives her name in the Gaelic form – NicMurrich – who was born in Drymen. Is this significant?
